ACTORS APPEARING ON STAGE

Sharon Powe has had one previous "walk-on" role in an SCT production and has worked backstage on numerous plays. She is presently the secretary for SCT. Jean Snyder has had former parts in two STC plays: Octette Bridge Club and Critic's Chocie. Bob Wolverton, a founding member and twice president of SCT, has had ten previous roles in SCT productions and directed Critic's Choice this past summer. Nelson Westmoreland states that his experience is "very limited." He appeared as the judge in last year's production of Harvey. Sam Dudley played the stage manager in SCT's production of Our Town. He is the narrator for the Mississippi ETV series, "Mississippi Roads." Ross Williams may be a little type-cast in his role as Dectective Inspector Hearne; he is a school attendance officer. He serves as SCT's Vice President for Business and has appeared in two previous productions, Philadelphia Story and Harvey. Norman Tramel is usually found backstage but has had several walk-on performances. Terry McDowell has appeared in three previous SCT productions, Philadelphia Story, Close Ties, and Octette Bridge Club. Her favorite 'hobby' is SCT. Greg Bentley made his first SCT appearance in Critic's Choice this past summer. Bob Fritzius has participated in three previous SCT plays: White Sheep of the Family, The Man Who Came to Dinner, and Harvey. Charles Petersen and Scott McDonnall haven't acted in any plays since their high school days. They're still wondering how they got involved in this one. Bill Stark, making his second appearance in an SCT production, previously played in John Brown's Body. Ron Walker has appeared in Little Mary Sunshine. The Man Who Came to Dinner, and Our Town, and has served as house manager for several productions. Clyde Kerr is a newcomer to SCT, although he's lived in Starkville for 11 years. Bill Parrish performed in John Brown's Body. Leonard Brandon played in The Man Who Came to Dinner and is one of our charter members. Howard Schickedanz, making his second SCT appearance, played the butler in Philadelphia Story. Betty Frnka, a veteran SCT performer, has acted in many SCT performances and was one of its charter members. Marvin Salin is back with SCT after a one-year sabbatical in West Germany. He has played in three previous productions: I Remember Mama, A Thousand Clowns, and Our Town. Edith Teasley, a veteran performer, has appeared in five SCT plays: White Sheep of the Family, The Man Who Came to Dinner, I Remember Mama, 40 Carats, and Harvey. Bob Mangum also has been involved in our community theatre; he played Papa in I Remember Mama. Donna Jean Luther, a theatre graduate of Millsaps College, is not new to the stage, but new to Starkville. She has played in one previous SCT production, Critic's Choice.
