—Monroe Dewberry Director FRANCES HELLER (M'Lynn) A charter member of SCT, Frances's roles range from president to vice-president for play selection to director (*Bell, Book and Candle; A Thousand Clowns*) to backstage work in costuming, props, makeup and set construction. Her on-stage roles include performances in *You Can't Take It With You* (1978-79)—SCT's first season—through SCT's award-winning *Octette Bridge Club* (1986-87) and ten other SCT shows. She is an instructor of English and theatre arts at Wood Junior College. Her son Chris is a senior at Starkville High School.

MADELINE GOLDEN (Shelby) Madeline's SCT credits include performances in this spring's *A Bad Year for Tomatoes, The Octette Bridge Club,* and four other shows. In addition, she has "paid her backstage dues" on properties and makeup crews for other shows and as assistant director of *Our Town.* An outstanding singer, Madeline is a secretary in the home economics division of the Mississippi Cooperative Extension Service.

TERRY R. MCDOWELL (Clairee) A native of Starkville, Terry has performed in Close Ties, The Philadelphia Story, How the Other Half Loves, The Octette Bridge Club, Witness for the Prosecution, and A Bad Year for Tomatoes. Her other SCT experience includes work on costume and makeup crews and the vice-presidency for membership. She and her husband Ledge are the parents of Ledge (13), Silas (11), and Matt (8).

EDITH TEASLEY (Ouiser) An SCT veteran, Edith's on-stage performances have included major character roles in *I Remember Mama, The Man Who Came to Dinner, White Sheep of the Family, Forty Carats, Witness for the Prosecution,* and *A Bad Year for Tomatoes.* Backstage work on makeup and first-night committees often interrupt her needlecraft, bike-riding, and oil painting activities. Edith is retired, but not really!

DONNA JEAN LUTHER (Truvy) A native of Eupora and a graduate of Millsaps College, Donna Jean is performing in her third SCT show. A graduate student and teaching assistant in MSU's Department of English, her time is divided, she says, "between teaching three sections of English Composition, grading papers, doing my own course work and doing this show." Whew!

BRENDA JACKSON (ANNELLE) Hailing from Lexington and Holmes Junior College, where she was an honors student and an active performer in the Holme Towne Players, Brenda is making her SCT debut in *Steel Magnolias*. Among her many interests is abstract painting. She is a cashier/clerk at B-Kwik.
