Ross Williams (Fred Narracott): Ross has been active in SCT productions for a number of years, as a performer and as Vice-President for Business and member, Board of Directors. Ross is the Oktibbeha County Youth Court School Attendance Officer, and works in the attendance office at Starkville High School with his wife, Diana. He has one daughter, LaShundra.

Sally Stapler (Vera Claythorne): Sally is a native of Georgia, and moved recently to Starkville.
