

#### about the cast...

Paul Ruff ("Gordon") is a pediatrician in Starkville, MS, and has been involved with Starkville Community Theatre since 1992. He has participated in about a dozen stage plays and eight musical revues – many alongside his wife, Cindy. In 2007, Paul appeared in the Mississippi Theatre Association Best Production and SETC Runner-Up Best Production, *Smoke on the Mountain*, in which he played the banjo-pickin' "Burl Sanders." In January, Paul was named MTA's Best Actor for his role in *Catfish Moon*.

Gabe Smith ("Curley") is a six-year SCT veteran, onstage and off-, and a two-time winner of the Mississippi Theatre Association's award for Best Actor. In addition to *Catfish Moon*, Gabe's productions at MTA include *Deadline Dawn*, *Loose Hog in the House of God*, and 2008's Runner-Up Best Production, "Art."

Krista Vowell ("Betty") currently serves as SCT president and has been an active member of the organization and of other Mississippi theatre organizations for a number of years, counting as favorites her roles in productions of *Bus Stop, Cat on a Hot Tin Roof, The Crucible, The Last Night of Ballyhoo*, and *Smoke on the Mountain*, for which she received a 2007 SETC Outstanding Performance by an Actress award. In January, Krista was named the Mississippi Theatre Association's Best Supporting Actress for her role in *Catfish Moon*.

Marcus Vowell ("Frog") appeared as "Stanley Sanders" in the 2007 Mississippi Theatre Association Best Production and SETC Runner-Up Best Production, Smoke on the Mountain. He has appeared at SCT in productions of The Lion in Winter, The Importance of Being Earnest, and The Last Night of Ballyhoo. Marcus lives in Starkville with his wife (currently playing "Betty") and two children and is a database administrator for East Mississippi Community College and a freelance voice-over artist.
