

A Memory Play

A Catered Affair is written as a memory play. "Memory play" is a term coined by playwright Tennessee Williams, describing his work *The Glass Menagerie*. In his production notes Williams says, "Being a 'memory play,' *The Glass Menagerie* can be presented with unusual freedom of convention." As suggested, the play is presented as moments. Feelings and events are remembered by the narrator, in our case Winston. Winston "directs" the show's action – sometimes talking directly to the audience and other times becoming part of the story itself.
