Michael A. Dendy

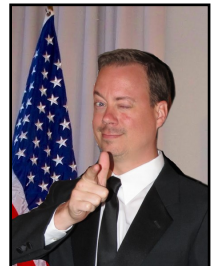

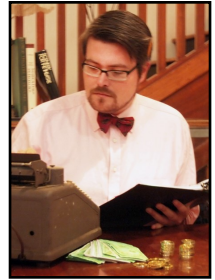

Pattye Archer and Paula Mabry, I thank you a thousand times over for listening and offering advice. I'm not sure I could have made it without you.

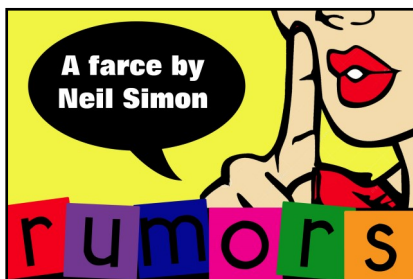

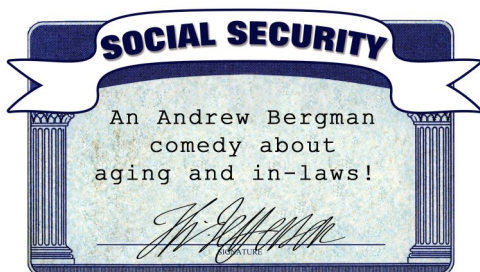
