**The Addams Family** by Marshall Brickman, Rick Elice, and Andrew Lippa From the publisher's description: *The Addams Family* features an original story, and it's every father's nightmare. #### Sylvia by A.R. Gurney

From the publisher's description, *Sylvia* is modern romantic comedy about a marriage and a dog. Greg and Kate have moved to Manhattan after 22 years of child-raising in the suburbs. Greg brings home a dog he found in the park—or that has found him—bearing only the name "Sylvia" on her name tag. A street-smart mixture of Lab and Poodle, Sylvia becomes a major bone of contention between husband and wife.
