SCT presents Let It Shine Feb. 15 and 16

Sharon Miles brings her onewoman show on civil rights heroine Fannie Lou Hamer to Starkville Community Theatre for two nights only.

Let It Shine: A Visit With Fannie Lou Hamer follows Hamer from humble Mississippi sharecropping to



monumental activism on the national stage, telling her story through conversation and song. The production will run Friday, Feb. 15 and Saturday, Feb. 16 at 7:30 p.m. at the Playhouse on Main.

In 1999, inspired by Hebert Randall's photographs of 1964s Freedom Summer activities in Hattiesburg, Frank Kuhn assembled quotes, news articles, letters to the editor, songs, and speeches into a documentary readers theatre piece, called *Voices of Freedom Summer*. Sharon Miles portrayed Hamer as a member of that ensemble. Sharon continued playing Hamer in revivals of the show and again in New Stage Theatre's production of *All the Way*, deepening her relationship with the historical figure. In 2015, Frank created *Let It Shine* as a solo performance piece for her. Two years of intensive research, drafts and redrafts, and rehearsals in Mississippi and New York followed, as they searched for the woman behind the icon.

SCT is proud to host this production. The show, however, is not part of any SCT season package, and the \$10 tickets are available on a first-come-first-served basis. All seating is reserved. Soon after an African-American businessman becomes new director of a foundation, he discovers the group's world-famous art collection includes several significant African sculptures tucked away in storage. A searing examination of racial politics that ultimately asks how much space - literally and figuratively - the white world gives to African-Americans and asks "what is the cost of failing to view the world through another's eyes?"
