To be directing a show about accepting ourselves, and others, and learning to love ourselves, and others, at this time in my life has been very moving and powerful. And isn't that what theatre is all about?

And to Vidur, Josh, Louie, Tillie, Kris and Anthony – I bow to you, I thank you, I love you. I am so very proud of each of you. "You're really good at this. (Of course, I like to think the proper mentoring helped, haha.)" It truly has been an honor and a blessing to watch you each embrace these roles and bring this beautiful story of inclusion, acceptance, and love to life. And so, its time. You're ready. Just remember, "who wants to walk when you've been taught to soar?"
